In order to vote, you MUST now bring a valid ID to the polling station. This is a new regulation. You can sign up to become a postal voter by Monday 17th April to avoid this.

Examples of acceptable forms of ID:

- Passport
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Driving Licence Blue Badge
